Miracle Tube



Optimizing plant growth requires balancing protection criteria with design attributes. Miracle Tube designs have an ivory color to prevent the absorption and retention of excessive heat. This protector also has the right amount of translucency to admit the proper amount of light and contains the perfect amount of venting. This concept allows the ideal amount of fresh air to circulate throughout the tube.

- Solid tubes furnished in nested groups of five units
- Sturdy, vented shelters available in 2 ft., 3 ft., 4 ft., 5 ft., and 6 ft. sizes
- Diameters range from 3.5 to 4.25 inches
- Has rolled top to eliminate limb damage

Weed Mat Squares



Stop weeds in their tracks. Woven poly plastic mats can be applied directly over brush and stubble.

Apply once and weed control is done. Mat will biodegrade in 3 to 5 years. The mats block weeds by blocking 99% of light while allowing water, nutrients, and air to pass through to your seedling. Sold in bundles of 25.

- Porous to air and water, while blocking 99% of light.
- Woven poly plastic, available in 3 ft. and 4 ft. squares.
- L-shaped center slit to accommodate tree and shelter
- Includes sod staples to secure to ground
